Especially child sexual abuse and activities relating to the sexual exploitation of young people.

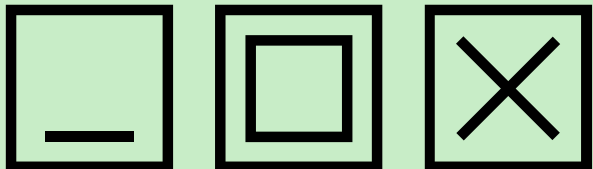


Hotline.ie aims to help combat the spread of online images of child abuse.

Each report we receive is assessed by our world-class Analysts against rigorous standards and by reference to Irish law. When content is classified as contrary to Irish law, action will be taken.
