A little background.

- The Consent- Ed Project builds upon the foundations laid by the esteemed Manuela Project.
- The program of learning is aimed at Senior Cycle students, Junior Cycle students and members of the Travelling Community.
 - Teachers are trained and supported to roll out Consent Ed within SPHE classes.
- The strategic partnerships behind Consent Ed are TUSLA, Galway Rape Crisis, and Pavee Point Traveller and Roma Centre.
 - The Consent Ed Project has been a 30 month endeavor.

Consent-Ed's fundamental construct.

- The creation, testing, and review of three comprehensive sexual violence prevention and awareness programs.
- Targeted audience: Senior cycle students (including Transition Year), Junior cycle students (2nd years), and the Travelling Community. Junior Cycle learning materials align with the new SPHE learning outcome.
- A strategic goal is to implement these programs among a wider audience of young people following on from the esteemed Manuela Programme.
